Summary – WV Jobs Act(*Senate Bill 103*)

- Projects Covered:**
1. All projects of \$500,000 or more and includes any level of state funding, excludes projects funded in whole or in part by federal funds;
 2. Includes any officer, board, commission or agency of the state but excludes counties and municipalities; and
 3. Includes the Economic Development Authority, Infrastructure and Jobs Development Council and the School Building Authority for loans, grants and bonds provided for public projects. *Provided*, That any project initiated by a county or local economic development authority and which is under the effective management of the county or local economic development authority shall be exempt.

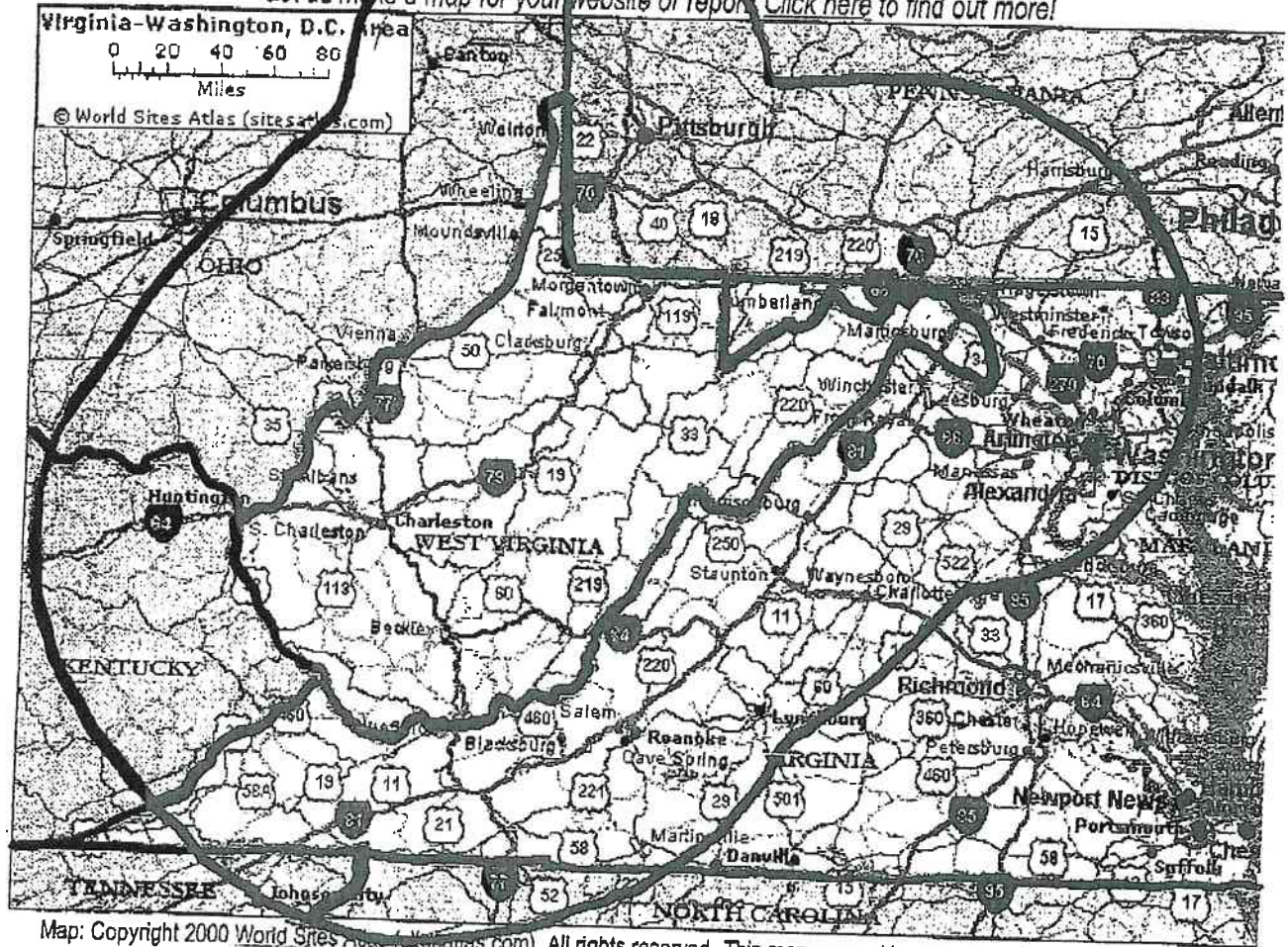
Labor Market: The “labor market” is defined as all West Virginia counties and any out-of-state county within seventy-five miles of the West Virginia border. (If a part of an out-of-state county is within the seventy-five mile limit, the whole of that county shall be included.)

Resident Worker: A person must have resided within the defined labor market for at least six months to be considered a resident.

Employment Quota: An employer must employ at least seventy-five percent of workers from the local labor market. Each employer is permitted at least two workers from outside the local market. If resident workers are not available, the employer may employ from outside the local market. *Provided*, proof of such unavailability (waiver certificate) must be obtained from the local office of the West Virginia Job Service. The employment requirement is in effect from September 1, 2001 through March 15, 2003.

Reporting: The public authority which lets the project shall file reports with the WV Division of Labor as the Division may require; at the minimum, to include a certified payroll and any employment waiver certificates. The reporting period is September 1, 2001 through October 15, 2002.
